




















# Tree Planting List

Species		Remarks
<b><i>Acer buergeranum</i></b> Trident maple		Small spreading tree with excellent fall color from yellow to bright red. Spring only planting
<b><i>Acer campestre</i></b> Hedge maple		Small urban tolerant tree with corky bark and yellow fall color.
<b><i>Acer ginnala</i></b> Amur Maple		Small spreading tree with red fall color. Very hardy and fits in tight spots.
<b><i>Acer griseum</i></b> Paperbark maple		Small spreading tree with striking cinnamon-brown exfoliating bark. Red to maroon fall color.
<b><i>Acer palmatum</i></b> Japanese maple		Ornamental tree in purple or green leaf. Also available Laceleaf varieties.
<b><i>Acer platanoides</i></b> Norway maple		Medium size shade tree. Many cultivars available. Crimson King and Royal Red are red leaf cultivars.
<b><i>Acer rubrum</i></b> Red maple		Medium size tree. Many cultivars available. Brilliant fall color.

<p><b><i>Acer saccharum</i></b> Sugar maple</p>		<p>Large species. Tree is restricted in number and location for planting. Orange fall color. For front campus planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Acer tataricum</i></b> Tatarian Maple</p>		<p>Red seeds in June and yellow fall color. Small urban tolerant tree.</p>
<p><b><i>Acer truncatum x</i></b> Norwegian Sunset maple Pacific Sunset maple</p>		<p>Yellow, orange fall color. Small shade tree.</p>
<p><b><i>Aesculus x carnea</i></b> Ruby Horsechestnut</p>		<p>Small colorful horsechestnut with red flowers.</p>
<p><b><i>Amelanchier spp.</i></b> Serviceberry</p>		<p>Small flowering tree (pink or white flowers) with fruit that attracts birds. Orange-scarlet fall color.</p>
<p><b><i>Betula nigra</i></b> River birch</p>		<p>Native tree with cinnamon exfoliating bark. Thrives in wet sites. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Carpinus caroliniana</i></b> American Hornbeam</p>		<p>Small spreading multi-stem tree with bluish-gray bark. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Celtis occidentalis</i></b> Hackberry</p>		<p>Medium sized tree with corky bark and yellow fall color. Withstands diverse conditions. Spring planting only.</p>

<b><i>Cercidiphyllum japonicum</i></b> Katsuratree		Medium sized tree with blue-green foliage. Yellow fall color. Spring planting only.
<b><i>Cladrastis kentukea</i></b> Yellowwood		Small multi stemmed tree with white, fragrant, large flowers. Yellow fall color and brown pods.
<b><i>Cornus kousa</i></b> Kousa Dogwood		Flowers in June, large red fruit and exfoliating bark.
<b><i>Coylus colurna</i></b> Turkish Filbert		Tan corky bark, thick shiny leaves. Yellow fall color.
<b><i>Crataegus crusgalli inermis</i></b> Cockspur Hawthorn		Small thornless tree with white flowers in June and red fruit in October. Spring planting only.
<b><i>Crataegus phaenopyrum</i></b> Washington Hawthorn		Small, spreading tree, single or multi stemmed. White flowers and red fruit. Spring planting only.
<b><i>Crataegus viridis</i></b> 'Winter King' Winter King Hawthorn		Small tree with showy white flowers and red-orange fruit that persists into winter. Spring planting only.
<b><i>Eucommia ulmoides</i></b> Hardy Rubber Tree		Medium sized, very unique shade tree. Glossy leaves. Pale yellow fall color.









<p><b><i>Evodia daniellii</i></b> Korean Evodia</p>		<p>Small, spreading tree with white flowers appearing in August.</p>
<p><b><i>Fagus grandiflora</i></b> American Beech</p>		<p>Large tree with smooth grey bark. Also, European beech varieties are available.</p>
<p><b><i>Ginkgo biloba</i></b> Maidenhair Tree</p>		<p>Large maintenance free tree. Fan shaped leaves with yellow fall color.</p>
<p><b><i>Gleditsia triacanthos inermis</i></b> Honey Locust</p>		<p>Yellow fall color, seedles varieties only. Very adaptable.</p>
<p><b><i>Gymnocladus dioica</i></b> Kentucky Coffeetree</p>		<p>Large tree, yellow fall color, with mahogany colored pods. Very durable tree.</p>
<p><b><i>Halesia carolina</i></b> Carolina silverbell</p>		<p>Profuse white bell shaped flowers with gray bark. Yellow fall color. Small tree. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Koelreuteria paniculata</i></b> Goldenraintree</p>		<p>Small spreading tree. Yellow flowers in July. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Liquidambar styraciflua</i></b> Sweetgum</p>		<p>Brilliant fall color. Star shaped leaves and a spiky capsule. Spring planting only.</p>

<p><b><i>Maackia amurensis</i></b> Amur Maackia</p>			<p>Small flowering tree with copper-brown bark. Very durable.</p>
<p><b><i>Malus spp.</i></b> Crabapple</p>			<p>Many varieties and flower color available. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Metasequoia glyptostroboides</i></b> Dawn Redwood</p>			<p>Large sized tree. Deciduous conifer, beautiful fern like foliage.</p>
<p><b><i>Nyssa sylvatica</i></b> Tupelo</p>			<p>Screaming red fall color. Upright branching tree. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Ostrya virginiana</i></b> American Hornbeam</p>			<p>Medium sized tree with spreading branches. Hop like fruit, yellow fall color.</p>
<p><b><i>Oxydendrum arboreum</i></b> Sourwood</p>			<p>Small sized tree, single or multistemmed. White flowers in July - August. Scarlet fall color. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Phellodendron amurense</i></b> Amur Corktree</p>			<p>Very hardy can withstand harsh urban conditions. Corky bark.</p>
<p><b><i>Platanus X acerifolia</i></b> London Planetree</p>			<p>Exfoliating bark, very tolerant of salt and soil compaction.</p>

<p><b><i>Quercus acutissima</i></b> Sawtooth Oak</p>		<p>Mature tree is often wider than tall. Yellow fall color. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Quercus alba</i></b> White Oak</p>		<p>Stately and slow growing. Choice tree for longevity. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Quercus coccinea</i></b> Scarlet Oak</p>		<p>Crimson-red fall color. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Quercus imbricaria</i></b> Shingle Oak</p>		<p>Narrow shiny green leaves. Performs well in urban conditions. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Quercus macrocarpa</i></b> Bur Oak</p>		<p>Broad crown with stout branches creating dense shade. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Quercus palustris</i></b> Pin Oak</p>		<p>Pyramidal habit. Red to bronze fall color. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Quercus phellos</i></b> Willow Oak</p>		<p>Willow like leaves, medium sized oak. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Quercus rubra</i></b> Red Oak</p>		<p>Very urban tolerant. Fall color is varying shades of red. Spring planting only.</p>



<p><b><i>Quercus shumardii</i></b> Shumard Oak</p>		<p>Stately oak similar to <i>rubra</i> but with a full spreading crown. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Robinia psuedoacacia</i></b> Black Locust</p>		<p>Large sized tree. Narrow, upright crown, fragrant, white flowers in May. Tolerant of urban conditions.</p>
<p><b><i>Sorbus alnifolia</i></b> Korean Mt. Ash</p>		<p>Fall produces red fruit with orange-yellow fall color. White flowers in May.</p>
<p><b><i>Stewartia pseudocamellia</i></b> Japanese Stewartia</p>		<p>Orange-red fall color and exfoliating bark. Small white flowering tree.</p>
<p><b><i>Styphnolobium japonicum</i></b> Scholartree</p>		<p>Creamy pea shaped flowers in late July. Yellow fall color.</p>
<p><b><i>Styrax spp.</i></b> Snowbell</p>		<p>White bell shaped flowers in June. Small tree or large shrub.</p>
<p><b><i>Syringa reticulata</i></b> Japanese Tree Lilac</p>		<p>Very trouble free tree. Small, flowering, hardy specimen.</p>
<p><b><i>Taxodium distichum</i></b> Baldcypress</p>		<p>Narrow, pyramidal shape. Brown red bark and orange rust fall color.</p>

<p><b><i>Tilia cordata</i></b> Littleleaf Linden</p>		<p>Yellow fall color and the flowers are very fragrant.</p>
<p><b><i>Tilia tomentosa</i></b> Silver Linden</p>		<p>Handles heat and drought well. Green leaf with silver undersides. Spring planting only.</p>
<p><b><i>Ulmus americana</i></b> American Elm</p>		<p>Upright arching and vase shaped. Yellow fall color.</p>
<p><b><i>Ulmus parvifolia</i></b> Lacebark Elm</p>		<p>Tree with exfoliating bark and small leaves.</p>
<p><b><i>Zelkova serrata</i></b> Japanese Zelkova</p>		<p>Reddish fall color, elegant vase shaped branching tree. Spring planting only.</p>
