## Location

- The Kent Campus is composed of 866 beautifully landscaped acres in the mid-size town of Kent, Ohio (population 28,000 ), surrounded by the major metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Akron, Canton and Youngstown.
- The Kent State University Airport and Golf Course are located nearby.
- Regional Campuses include: Ashtabula, East Liverpool, Geauga (Burton and Twinsburg), Salem, Stark (Canton), Trumbull (Warren), and Tuscarawas (New Philadelphia).


## Our Students

- The Kent Campus is home to 23,328 undergraduate students; 13,776 are female and 9,552 are male.
- The Regional Campuses enroll nearly 13,000 students.
- Kent State students come from all 50 states and 100 foreign countries with a 12 percent multicultural student population.


## Areas of Study

- Select from 282 bachelor's degree programs.
- Kent State is ranked among the nation's 74 public research universities demonstrating high-research activity by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching.
- Kent State's Honors College was founded in 1933 and is one of the most respected honors programs in the country.
- Academic Calendar: Semesters, fall and spring, and a summer session.


## Faculty/Classes

- More than 53 percent of classes have 20 or fewer students.
- Ninety-two percent of classes have 50 or fewer students.
- More than 1,702 instructional faculty are at the Kent Campus.

## Scholarships and Financial Aid

- To be considered for freshman scholarships, incoming freshmen must submit a complete admissions application by Jan. 15, 2016.

- More than $\$ 50$ million in scholarships were awarded to admitted freshmen last year.
- More than 92 percent of Kent State's freshmen received some form of financial assistance.

## Admissions Policy

- Freshman admission at the Kent Campus is selective.
- Admission decisions are based on the following: cumulative grade point average, ACT and/or SAT scores, strength of high school college preparatory curriculum and grade trends.


## Admissions Timeline

- Thanksgiving: Recommended date for submitting admissions application. We recommend applying online.
- Jan. 15: Deadline to submit admissions application to be considered for freshman scholarships.
- Feb. 15: Priority deadline to submit the FAFSA to the federal processor.
- March 1: Deadline to submit a freshman application for fall 2016.
- May 1: Deadline to confirm your place in the freshman class for fall 2016.
