Location

- The Kent Campus is composed of 866 beautifully landscaped acres in the mid-size town of Kent, Ohio (population 28,000), surrounded by the major metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Akron, Canton and Youngstown.

Admissions Timeline

- Thanksgiving: Recommended date for submitting admissions application. We recommend applying online.
- Jan. 15: Deadline to submit admissions application to be considered for freshman scholarships.
- Feb. 15: Priority deadline to submit the FAFSA to the federal processor.
- March 1: Deadline to submit a freshman application for fall 2016.
- May 1: Deadline to confirm your place in the freshman class for fall 2016.
