**NOTE 3:** A minimum "B-" grade earned and a minimum 2.70 average is required for ACCT 23020 (or ACTT 11000) and ACCT 23021 (or ACTT 11001). If a student does not have at least a B- in both ACCT 23020 (ACTT 11000 or equivalent) and ACCT 23021 (or ACTT 11001 or equivalent) but the student does have an average GPA of at least 2.700 in ACCT 23020 (or ACTT 11000 or equivalent) and ACCT 23021 (ACTT 11001 or equivalent), the student can apply to the Accounting Department for an override to be admitted to junior level accounting courses.

# **General Electives** (9 credit hours)

Students may take or use any course at any level as long as the minimum 39-credithours requirement for upper-division courses is satisfied for graduation with a B.B.A.

Exceptions: Maximum 4 credit hours of Physical Activity, Wellness and Sport (PWS) courses may be counted toward the 120 total credit hours or 39 upper-division-credit-hour graduation requirement. General elective courses may be selected from any area and at any level provided students do not go over the PWS restriction and they satisfy the 39 credit hour upper-division requirements. A minor (business or non-business) is encouraged. Any other exceptions must be approved by the assistant dean.
