The University Teaching Council's Summer Teaching Development Grant \$9,000 10 Week Project/\$4,500 5 Week Project

These are intended to enhance student learning by engaging faculty to significantly improve teaching methods, develop curricula, or create innovative course materials. The project must exceed normal course preparation, and it should either improve current pedagogical practices or introduce new pedagogical methods or materials that will significantly improve teaching and enhance student learning beyond a single course or single faculty member. 
FREE VIRTUAL ONE-HOUR WEBINARS
