Badar-Kauffman Conference on Contemporary Issues in Special Education Research

Overview

Purpose/Goals: The goal of the Badar-Kauffman Conference is to provide a highly interactive learning experience useful to presenters and audience members alike. All participants have the shared goal of advancing the rigor and utility of scientific research, logical thinking, and conceptual analysis in special education. Attendees are expected to engage in critical discussion on conceptual, methodological, and practical issues.

Session Formats: All sessions are intended to be highly interactive. Presentations will occur in the following formats throughout the conference:

Oral presentations – Presentations by individuals or groups on a central study or group of studies on a closely related topic. All oral presentations must include 20-30 minutes of time for questions/comments from attendees. Each oral presentation will be assigned a moderator to elicit questions, provide commentary, monitor time, and keep the discussion focused on the session topic.

Roundtable sessions – Roundtable sessions are informal discussions around critical topics led by 2-3 highly knowledgeable scholars. Session leaders will pose questions, provide recommendations, and discuss practical scenarios around a topic.

Networking sessions – Networking sessions are designed to help early career researchers build their network of professional contacts, collaborators, and friends. *We encourage all attendees to participate.*

Panel discussion – A select group of scholars will reflect on the content of presentations, summarize important take-aways, and discuss ways in which the work present may impact special education research in the future.

Participation: All presenters are expected to manage time appropriately and reserve ample time for discussion. Audience members are encouraged to engage presenters in collegial, good natured, and professionally useful critique. Attendees are expected to participate in sessions throughout the entirety of the conference.

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


Policy on Professional Discourse and Conduct
