In collaboration with CIIE, the Bureau has been awarded the evaluation of Toyota innovations in STEAM education in an exchange with Ann Arbor and Singapore educators. Funded by Toyota Motor Sales, USA, Inc., and administered by the Institute of International Education (IIE), this professional development program for US secondary school educators is designed to support efforts to prepare and inspire an increased number of US students to study and pursue careers in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and mathematics) fields. Career & Technical Education's Jennings Grant for Internationalizing CTE Programs in Ohio


