Proposal Summary

Title: Program Requirement Revisions to BS Sports Administration and BS Recreation, Park and Tourism majors.

Subject Specification: This proposal will revise the program requirements for the Bachelor of Science Sports Administration [BS SPAD] and the Bachelor of Science Recreation, Park and Tourism Management with a concentration in Tourism Management [BS RPTM TMM].

Background Information: Currently, the BS SPAD and BS RPTM TMM programs require the Business minor as part of their curriculum. Recently, the College of Business Administration made revisions to the minor that are effective Fall, 2011. SPAD and RPTM propose to revise their requirements to reflect the changes made to the BUS minor.

Alternatives and Consequences: The consequences would be that students may not be taking the necessary courses to receive a minor in Business.

Specific Recommendation and Justification: The following are the recommendations to reflect revisions made to the BUS minor:

- Remove ACCT 23021 Introduction to Managerial Accounting (3 credits)
- Remove CS 10061 *Intro to Computer Program* (3 credits) as an option with MIS 24053 *Computer Applications* (MIS 24053 is still required)
- Increase general electives by 3 credits, to adjust for the 3 credit course removal and to maintain the 121 credits required to complete the program

Minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA; or if new freshman, no established GPA is required.

Requirement to graduate with the business minor:

Minimum 2.50 GPA (including all attempts in 30000 level courses) is required in the minor courses.

Notes:

- To earn a College of Business Administration minor, students must complete at least two courses in the minor at Kent State University on a graded basis. At least one of these courses must be at the upper-division (30000 or 40000) level.
- It is recommended that students pursuing a business minor take a statistics course and an operations course. Recommended statistics course: MIS 24056 Fundamentals of Business Statistics Recommended operations course: MIS 34060 Operations Management (prerequisites are MIS 24053 and MIS 24056).
- The AACSB accreditation standards prohibit non-business majors from taking more than 25 percent of their degree requirements in business courses. Therefore, maximum 32 semester credit hours may be counted toward stated degree requirements.
