Proposal Summary

Title: Establish a new minor in Nonprofit Studies.

Subject Specification: The intent of this proposal is to inactivate the certificate in Nonprofit/Human Service Management [C126] and establish a minor in Nonprofit Studies administrated by the Human Development and Family Studies (HDFS) program area within the School of Lifespan Development and Educational Sciences (LDES).

Background Information: Currently, the post-secondary certificate in Nonprofit/Human Service Management (NPHSM) program is viable with a strong enrollment of approximately 57 students from approximately 21majors. There have been 123 graduates since the inception of the program in 2002; 57 of these graduates have been in the past 3 years (2009-2011). However, due to rapid growth in the program and an increasing demand for inquiry into the field of nonprofit management, a new minor is being established for undergraduate students.

There are over 1.9 million nonprofit organizations in the United States that are in need of entry-level professionals to serve their mission. To meet this demand, there is an increasing number of majors, minors, and master's programs in nonprofit studies that currently exist in colleges and universities throughout the United States and abroad. Educational programs related to nonprofit management grew very quickly in the 1990s and 2000s. In a 2007 report, Mirabella revealed that the number of undergraduate programs related to nonprofit management grew by 30 percent between 1996 and 2002 and by an additional 36 percent between 2002 and 2006. The number of graduate programs grew by 26 percent over the decade between 1996 and 2006. By 2006, a total of 426 programs in nonprofit management were being offered at 238 colleges and universities. This minor will provide formalized guidance to students in selecting courses in the nonprofit field and will provide recognition of that work on their transcript.

Additionally, Kent State University's Provost's office recommends this action be taken to reflect the nature of the program. With this minor, students would be better equipped to enter the nonprofit field with this distinction on their transcript. The interdisciplinary nature of this program will prepare students for careers in nonprofit settings, such as museums, parks and human service organizations.

Each year, international, national, and local non-profit organizations need thousands of new full-time professional staff. Individuals who fill these positions are people-oriented, competent managers and are committed to improving their communities and the future. The Nonprofit Studies minor provides students with knowledge and competencies in areas such as grant writing and fundraising, mission and vision, advocacy and lobbying, risk management, board development, program planning, leadership and ethics, human resource development, youth and adult development, marketing, financial management, and non-profit management. These students will perform a 3-credit internship at a nonprofit organization where they will further develop their professionalism through experiential learning.

Alternatives and Consequences:

Since the program already exists as a certificate, the creation of this minor will have no negative impact on staffing, students, or current programs.

Specific Recommendation and Justification:

Inactivate the C126 certificate and establish a minor in Nonprofit Studies, program requirements attached.
