# Summary statement describing the proposed action:

The intent of this proposal is to revise the Bachelor of Science Human Development and Family Studies major, Gerontology and Nursing Home Administration concentration curriculum to reflect newly established courses (BS HDFS GNHA).

GERO 43092 Practicum in Nursing Home Administration I and GERO 43192 Practicum in Nursing Home Administration II will replace GERO 44092 Practicum in Gerontology.

**GERO 4/54032** Long Term Care Administration will be a requirement, replacing a special topics course with the same name (GERO 41095).

GERO 30656 Psychology of Aging will be removed as a Major Elective choice and added as a Core Requirement.

HDFS 44031 Intergenerational Family Caregiving will be removed as a Core Requirement and added to the Major Elective choices.

# **Proposal Summary**

**Title:** A proposal to revise the Bachelor of Science in Human Development and Family Studies with a concentration in Gerontology and Nursing Home Administration (HDFS-BS-GNHS).

**Subject Specification:** This proposal is intended to revise the B.S. in Human Development and Family Studies (HDFS) with a concentration in Gerontology and Nursing Home Administration (GNHA). This program is designed for gerontology students, who upon graduation, want to secure administrative positions in the nursing home industry.

# **Background Information:**

GERO 30656 Psychology of Aging is currently being offered as a Major Elective choice. It is proposed to make this course a Core Requirement.

GERO 43092/43192 Practicum in Nursing Home Administration I & II were formerly taught as GERO 44092 Practicum in Gerontology, which GNHA students repeated for a total of 20 credits with 800 internship hours.

The *Practicum in Gerontology* course is not designed for the GNHA students who have significantly different internship requirements than gerontology (GERO) students who are not pursuing administrator licensure.

Whereas GERO students will continue to have GERO 44092 as a practicum option available for them, GNHA students will receive the curriculum that is set forth by BENHA in the new courses. Additionally, each semester's practicum requires different course content, so students cannot simply repeat a semester of practicum.

HDFS 44031 Intergenerational Family Caregiving which is currently a Core Requirement will be moved to the Major Elective section. While this course is beneficial, there currently is not staff available to offer it on a regular basis.

GERO 4/54032 Long Term Care Administration was formerly a Nursing special topics course for several years and then a Gerontology (GERO 41095) special topics course for the past two years. This slash-level course provides an introduction to the principles of administration of long-term care administration and is a core requirement for the Nursing Home Administrator's Licensure Examination administered by the Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administration (BENHA) for the State of Ohio.

Because these courses currently exist in other forms, there will be no effect on current offerings, staffing, or other units/programs.

Alternatives and Consequences: Quality of curriculum will be compromised if proposed course changes are not implemented. Consequently, graduates' career success in the field of long-term care may be negatively impacted.

Specific Recommendation and Justification: Currently, the GNHA program requires 137 total credits to graduate. With the approval of this proposal, the hours would be reduced to 121, without losing any content. Nursing Home Administration Core requirements would replace 6 credits of electives. Additionally, because the new practicum courses are now 5 credits each instead of 10, they will not only realine the curriculum with university recommendations for practicum contact hours, but will make the degree more attractive to potential students. The curriculum as set forth will not require the extra semester to complete.

#### Curriculum revisions include:

**GERO 30656** *Psychology of Aging* will be removed as a Major Elective choice and added as a Core Requirement. The specific old age focus on mental health and other geropsychological issues (e.g., cognitive and self-regulative changes) in this course will be of great importance to nursing home administrators.

GERO 43092/43192 Practicum in Nursing Home Administration I & II replace GERO 44092 Practicum in Gerontology as internship requirements in the Nursing Home Administration Core requirements. (See above for justification)

HDFS 44031 Intergenerational Family Caregiving will be removed as a Core Requirement and added to the Major Elective choices. Currently staffing resources do not allow HDFS to offer this course; therefore, it cannot be required of the students. Placing it as an elective, allows for future opportunities if staffing becomes available.

**GERO 4/54032** Long Term Care Administration replace **GERO 41095** Special Topics: Long Term Care Administration.

#### Special Notes for Degree/Major:

A minimum 2.25 GPA or better is required in all major coursework.

#### Liberal Education Requirements (LER)

Students must complete a minimum 36 credit hours of Liberal Education Requirements. Colleges or degree programs may specify certain courses to fulfill the requirements. Courses in the students' major field will not count toward the completion of any LER. Honors equivalents shall satisfy the LER. None of the courses on the LER list may be taken with a pass/fail grade.

#### **Diversity Course Requirement**

Students must complete a two-course diversity requirement, consisting of one with a domestic focus and one with a global focus. One course must be come from the LER and cannot be in the student's major. The second course may be taken as a second LER; or within a major or minor; or as a general elective; or, with dean's approval, by completing one semester of study in another country.

## Writing-Intensive Course Requirement

Students must complete a one-course writing-intensive requirement in their major and earn minimum C (2.00) grade.

#### Upper-Division Requirement

In general, baccalaureate programs require the successful completion of at least 39 upper-division (numbered 30000 to 49999) credit hours of coursework. Programs in the College of Arts and Sciences require a minimum of 42 hours of upper-division coursework.
