## Proposal Summary Large-Scale Course Revisions

**Subject Specification:** This proposal will revise the subject of all Secondary Education [SEED] courses to Adolescent and Adult Learning [ADED].

Background Information: We feel that there is continuing confusion in that we have two subjects (SEED and ADED) to denote the courses in one (ADED) program. Apparently, there is history that the SEED subject was once used to denote Masters of Arts in Teaching (MAT) courses. However, in talking with the MAT faculty, led by MAT Coordinator, Janice Hutchison, we feel that that designation is no longer useful. In fact, MAT courses in other programs do not use separate prefixes for their MAT courses. The fact is, whether a person graduates from the undergrad ADED program or the graduate ADED program (MAT), the person will still be licensed to teach in grades 7-12. We want both the undergraduate programs and the MAT program to be identified as being housed in the ADED program, and we need to use the same subject (ADED) to do that.

There will be no impact to any other program, as the courses are specific to ADED students.

Alternatives and Consequences: If not approved, courses will remain as they are.

#### HI, Susan:

This is the email that you said you need to put into process the inactivation of some courses and the change of prefix of others. I've provided you with that list in a previous email.

We want to inactivate the list of courses, simply because we no longer teach them. In fact, most of them haven't been taught for years. They don't fit into our NCATE accreditation requirements. There is no way that they would ever be taught again.

Regarding the change in prefix, we feel that there is continuing confusion in that we have two prefixes (SEED and ADED) to denote the courses in one program (ADED). Apparently, there is some history that the SEED prefix was once used to denote MAT courses. However, in talking with the MAT faculty, led by MAT Coordinator, Janice Hutchison, we feel that that designation is no longer useful. In fact, MAT courses in other programs do not use separate prefixes for their MAT courses. The fact is, whether a person graduates from the undergrad ADED program or the graduate ADED program (MAT), the person will still be licensed to teach in grades 7-12. We want both the undergraduate programs and the MAT program to be identified as being housed in the ADED program, and we need to use the same prefix (ADED) to do that.

Here is some supporting documentation.

- 1. Our ADED faculty have voted via listsery on September 13, 2011 that a) we want the aforesaid list of courses to be inactivated and b) we want prefixes of all remaining active courses with the SEED prefix to be changed to ADED. All faculty who responded to the email responded affirmatively to these proposals. These faculty were: Kristy Pytash, William Kist, Alicia Crowe, Bette Brooks, Scott Courtney, Lisa Donnelly, Walter Gershon, and Janice Hutchison. No faculty responded negatively.
- 2. In addition, I have solicited a separate email from MAT Coordinator, Janice Hutchison, in support of the unified ADED prefix. I will forward that email to you immediately after I send this one.
- 3. No one else uses the courses we are inactivating or the courses we are changing the prefixes of.
