

Proposal Summary

Title: INLA Course Requirement Revisions.

Subject Specification: Program requirement revision for the Bachelor of Science in Education degree in Integrated Language Arts [BSE INLA].

Background information

This proposal is to revise course requirements to reflect changes made by the English and Journalism & Mass Communication departments.

Alternatives and Consequences

ENG and JMC courses are being phased out or revised so that they do not meet the needs of our students. Without approval of this proposal, INLA students will not receive the necessary curriculum.

Specific Recommendation and Justification

- 1) Remove the following courses from major requirements:
 - ENG 30001 *English Studies* (3) because it is being inactivated (remove from *English as a Field of Study* category).
 - JMC 20004 *Media Writing* (3) because the content is being revised to target advertising majors and will no longer meet our students' needs.
- 2) Add the following courses to major requirements:
 - ENG 24001 *Introduction to Literary Studies* (3); this newly-establish course will replace ENG 30001 in the *English as a Field of Study* category.
 - JMC 26001 *News Writing* (3) better meets the needs of INLA students (per JMC: prerequisites will be waived for INLA students)
- 3) Currently, students are required to take ENG 25001 *English Studies* in the *British Literature* category of the Major Coursework. In addition to this course, this proposal will give students the option of three other courses: ENG 34001 *Medieval Literature* (3), ENG 34002 *British Literature 1500-1660* (3), or ENG 34003 *British Literature 1660-1800* (3). Students are often shut out of ENG 25001 and this will provide more opportunities for students to register.
- 4) Currently, students must choose one from ENG 20021 *Introduction to Creative Writing* (3) or ENG 39895 *ST: Teaching Poetry in the Schools* (3) to fulfill the *Writing* category within the Major Coursework. ENG 39895 was a Special Topics course, which is being established as a new course: ENG 43092 *Teaching Poetry in the Schools* (3), and will now be listed as an option with ENG 20021.

DESCRIPTION: This program prepares candidates for Ohio licensure in Integrated Language Arts (grades 7-12). The combination of content and methods courses provides a strong foundation for graduates of the program, who will be licensed to teach English/Language Arts, journalism, communication and theater. (Please note that Ohio Integrated Language Arts teachers are only licensed to teach theater at the middle school level.) The program uniquely features a methods course devoted to the teaching of new media.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES: Preschool, kindergarten, elementary school, middle school, and secondary school teachers, except special education, held about 4.0 million jobs in 2006. Of the teachers in those jobs, about 1.5 million are elementary school teachers, 1.1 million are secondary school teachers, 674,000 are middle school teachers, 437,000 are preschool teachers, and 170,000 are kindergarten teachers. The vast majority work in elementary and secondary schools. Preschool teachers, except special education, are most often employed in child daycare services (59 percent), public and private educational services (16 percent), and religious organizations (15 percent). Employment of teachers is geographically distributed much the same as the population. (Source: Bureau of Labor Statistics)

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: Students admitted to the College of Education, Health, and Human Services as freshmen must have been fully admitted to the university. Admission to the college does not guarantee admission to a major and/or admission to professional coursework for a selective admission program. To be admitted directly into a teacher education program and Community Health, it is required that new freshmen have a 2.75 high school GPA and 16 units of college preparatory curriculum or a 21 ACT or 980 SAT score. Students who do not meet the GPA requirements of their intended major may enroll as pre-majors for selected programs or EHHS General until which time they have the required 2.75 GPA.

Students seeking admission to this program must meet all professional requirements for admission to advanced study. To be admitted to the program, students must display evidence of adequate communication skills; sound content area knowledge (language arts, mathematics, science or social studies); a basic understanding of the teaching profession; a basic understanding of adolescents; and dispositions aligned with the conceptual framework of the College of Education, Health, and Human Services, including being open-minded, flexible, caring and responsible. Faculty will select the most qualified applicants based on an interview; letters of recommendation; GPA; Praxis I scores; and performance in English and communication studies coursework. Applicants to the ADED program must have experience working with young adults in a supervisory capacity, such as tutoring, camp counseling, volunteer work or related experience. Students should contact the College of Education, Health, and Human Services' Vacca Office of Student Services, 304 White Hall, during the first year of study to inquire about the procedures and criteria associated with admission to the adolescence/young adult education program.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: Minimum 121 credit hours. Minimum 2.60 major GPA. Minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA. A minimum grade of C (2.0) grade is required in some courses; view the program requirements to see specific courses.
