

## **Proposal Summary**

**Title:** INSS Course Requirement Revisions

**Subject Specification:** Program requirement revision for the Bachelor of Science in Education degree in Integrated Social Studies [BSE] [INSS].

### **Background Information**

The BSE degree in INSS includes a choice of five concentrations: Economics [ECON], Geography [GEOG], Political Science [POL], Sociology [SOC], and History [HIST]. This proposal is to revise course requirements to better reflect the current course offerings in the History department. These changes are also part of an attempt to limit the need for course substitutions.

### **Alternatives and Consequences**

The History department is currently working to update, revise and inactivate many of their courses. Therefore our only alternative would be to continue to make course substitutions to reflect the courses that are being offered.

### **Specific Recommendations and Justification**

Within the Economics concentration:

- 1) Remove HIST 31061 *History of Ohio* (3) as an elective option under the upper division History category. This change is designed to better reflect the content INSS majors will be teaching when they graduate.
- 2) Add the option that students may take courses designated Europe since 1500 as an elective option under the upper division History category. These courses are listed at the end of this proposal (see \*\*\* below). This addition is designed to better meet the needs of INSS students.

Within the Geography concentration:

- 1) Remove HIST 31061 *History of Ohio* (3) as an elective option under the upper division History category. This change is designed to better reflect the content INSS majors will be teaching when they graduate.
- 2) Add the option that students may take courses designated Europe since 1500 as an elective option under the upper division History category. These courses are listed at the end of this proposal (see \*\*\* below). This addition is designed to better meet the needs of INSS students.

Within the Political Science concentration:

- 1) Remove HIST 31061 *History of Ohio* (3) as an elective option under the upper division History category. This change is designed to better reflect the content INSS majors will be teaching when they graduate.
- 2) Add the option that students may take courses designated Europe since 1500 as an elective option under the upper division History category. These courses are listed

  - HIST 31061 *History of Ohio*. This change is designed to better reflect the content INSS majors will be teaching when they graduate.
  - HIST 41070 *American Social and Intellectual History 1790-1876* because this course is being inactivated by the History department.
  - HIST 41074 *American Economic History* because this course is being inactivated by the History department.
  - HIST 41079 *History of the Immigrant in America* because this course is being revised by the History department and now has a new name.
  - HIST 41082 *Constitutional History of the United States* because this course is being inactivated by the History department.
- 2) Add the following course to the list of elective options under the upper division History Category.
  - HIST 41079 *Migrations to America, 1607 – Present*. This addition reflects changes to the course and is designed to better meet the needs of our students.
- 3) Add the following course as an elective option under the 20<sup>th</sup> Century U.S. History Category.
  - HIST 41084 *U.S. Foreign Relations from 1920*. This addition is designed to better meet the needs of our students.
- 4) Remove the following courses from the Non-Western History category
  - HIST 41114 *Economic History of East Asia in Modern Times* because it is being inactivated by the History department.
  - HIST 41143 *20<sup>th</sup> Century Mexico* because this course is being inactivated by the History Department.
  - HIST 42297 *Colloquium: China and Japan* because this course is being inactivated by the History department.
  - HIST 45697 *Colloquium: Social History of Latin America* because this course is being inactivated by the History department.

- HIST 45797 *Colloquium: Comparative Latin American Revolutions* because this course is being inactivated by the History Department.


