The *Teacher Education Semester in Florence* is organized through the collaboration of the **Office of Global Education and the College of Education Health and Human Services.**



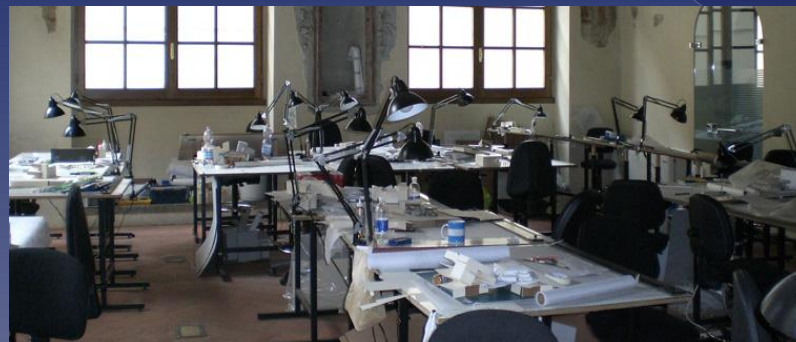


The Kent Campus in Florence, Italy:

Campus-Palazzo dei Cerchi & Piazza Santa Croce

Palazzo dei Cerchi-A medieval palace right in the heart of the city. Built in the 13th century and completely restored in 2003, the Palazzo dei Cerchi is an amazing place to study, with 700-year-old frescos on the walls and wireless Internet throughout

Piazza Santa Croce-The building was a medieval palace located within a short walking distance from Palazzo dei Cerchi. This location was recently renovated and formally opened with a reception in November 2012 for the Education Program.

Student Housing





Participants in the semester program live in apartments or optional home stays arranged by the Program staff.

The apartments are all located within the ancient city walls, with a range in walking time to the Palazzo dei Cerchi of 10 to 20 minutes. The apartments accommodate 2 to 6 persons, and generally have two single beds in each bedroom.

All apartments have kitchen and bathroom facilities and a community space.

Students are responsible for their meals and usually prepare their food in the apartment with groceries purchased at nearby markets or eat in local restaurants and trattorias.



All housing costs are paid to Kent State prior to departure.
