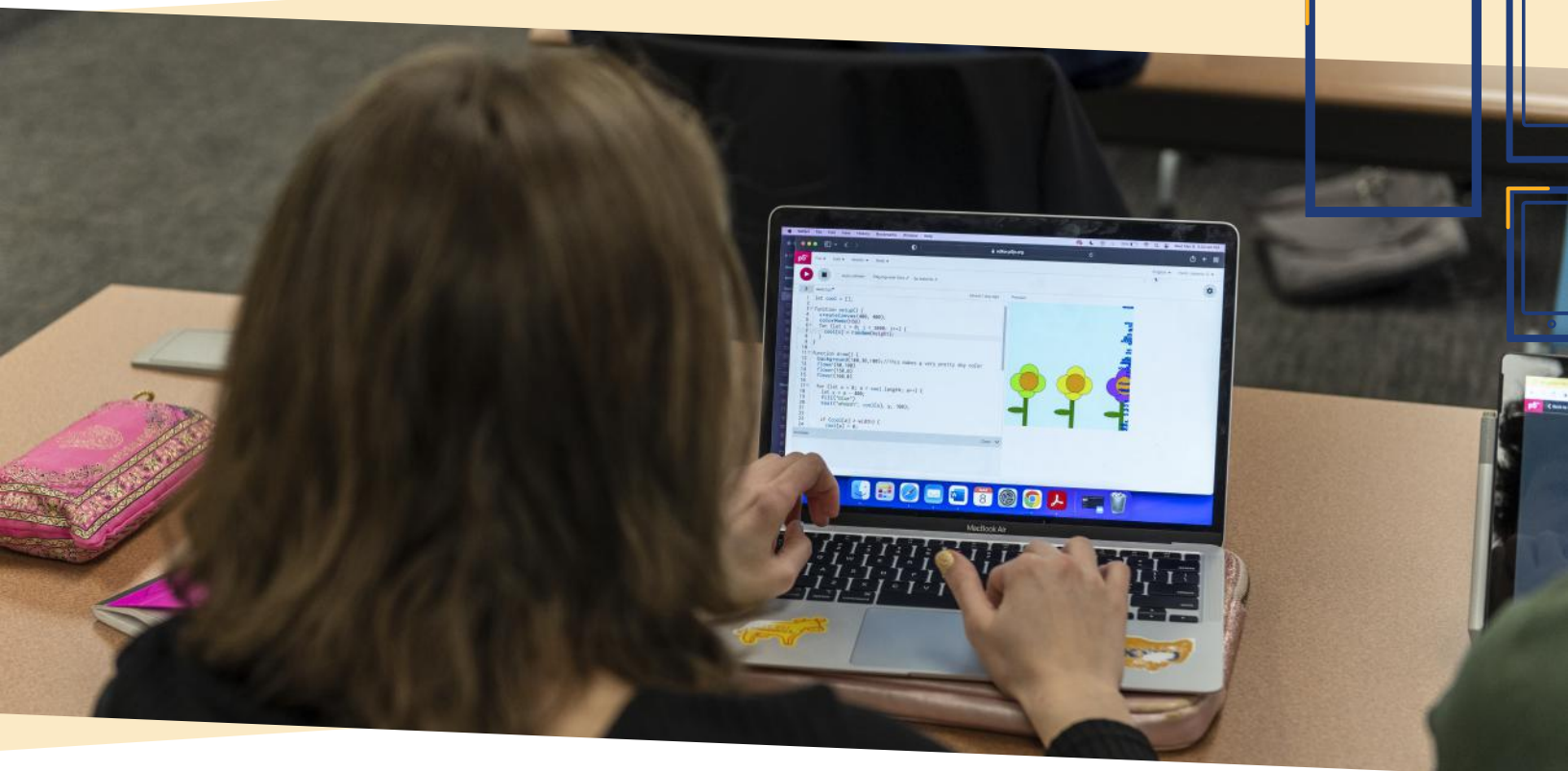


IMMERSE YOURSELF IN
