Graduate Awards and Fellowships

Graduate Dean's Award (GDA)

The GDA seeks to enhance KSU's recruitment of academically excellent incoming students with diverse backgrounds.

Award and Eligibility:

\$5,000 distributed over two academic years (four consecutive semesters \$1,250 per semester).

- An <u>applicant</u> to a master's or doctoral degree program;
- A U.S. citizen (or national) or a permanent resident of the U.S; and
- A member of an underrepresented group in their discipline (e.g., women in traditionally male-dominated disciplines, McNair Scholars, individuals with disabilities, ethnic/racial minorities).
- Full-time enrollment required.

Graduate Dean's Travel Award (GDTA)

The GDTA assists <u>applicants</u> with the costs of travel to Kent for campus interviews and visits; this award seeks to enhance Kent State University's <u>recruitment</u> of academically excellent students with diverse backgrounds.

Award and Eligibility:

GDTA's are offered at two levels (\$400 and \$200), depending on cost of travel.

- An <u>applicant</u> to a master's or doctoral degree program;
- A U.S. citizen (or national) or a permanent resident of the U.S; and
- A member of an underrepresented group in their discipline (e.g., women in traditionally male-dominated disciplines, McNair Scholars, individuals with disabilities, ethnic/racial minorities).

David B. Smith Scholarship

The David B. Smith Scholarship is presented annually to recognize exceptional scholarship and teaching.

Award and Eligibility:

Recipients receive a \$500 monetary award.

- Must be a currently enrolled graduate degree-seeking student.
- Minimum graduate GPA of 3.5; full-time enrollment required.

Mary Ann Stephens and John R. Graham Award

The Mary Ann Stephens and John R. Graham Award for Excellence in Graduate Research and Scholarship is presented annually to a doctoral student underrepresented in their discipline.

Award and Eligibility:

Recipients receive a \$500 monetary award.

- Must be a currently enrolled full-time doctoral student.
- U.S. citizen (or national) or a permanent resident of the U.S.
- From a group that is considered underrepresented (e.g., women in traditionally male-dominated disciplines, individuals with disabilities, and ethnic/racial minorities).
- Preference given to graduate students pursuing a Doctor of Philosophy degree from STEM disciplines (as defined by the National Science Foundation).

Graduate Awards and Fellowships

Lillian Friedman Scholarship

The Lillian Friedman Scholarship is presented to recognize an outstanding graduate student contributing to the area of mental health.

Award and Eligibility:

Recipients receive a \$1,000 monetary award.

- Must be a currently enrolled graduate degree-seeking student.
- Thesis or dissertation research in progress.
- Studying a significant topic in mental health.
- Minimum graduate GPA of 3.5.

Reuter Fellowship in Developmental Sciences

The Reuter Fellowship provides recipients with an academic year non-service appointment to allow for full-time work on the dissertation.

Award and Eligibility:

Recipients receive a non-service fellowship appointment for the academic year in the amount of \$12,000.

- Must be a currently enrolled full-time doctoral student.
- Admitted to candidacy by date of application.
- Enrollment in Dissertation I or II.
- Study on a topic directly bearing on human development.
- Minimum graduate GPA of 3.5.

University Fellowship

The University Fellowship is awarded annually to advanced doctoral students to recognize excellent scholarship and research potential.

Award and Eligibility:

University Fellowship recipients receive a doctoral level service appointment for Fall semester (from department) and a <u>non-service</u> University Fellowship appointment for Spring semester (from the Graduate College).

- Full-time doctoral status.
- Admitted to candidacy by date of nomination.
- Enrollment in Dissertation II during Fall and Spring semesters of the fellowship year.
- Outstanding scholarship and research potential.

Nominations and Selections:

- Students must be nominated by their program/department. Graduate coordinators should submit all nominations to the Graduate College.
- Nomination window will open the first week in January & are due by midnight on **February 15**.
- All nominees are reviewed by a committee comprised of faculty representing various ranks and disciplines. Recipients are selected by the Dean of the Graduate College.
