How to opt in and participate:

How to do a Poker Walk

- You'll need a deck of cards, a large area to walk (can be inside or out) and a group of people to play.
- Specify a walking route (i.e. a lap around the building outside, a lap inside around one floor, etc.).
- Designate one person as the dealer. This person must understand the rules of poker.
 The dealer will remain in a fixed location on the walking route to pass out cards to participants.
 - o Employees may take turns being the dealer so that all can get their moves in. If you want to play multiple rounds, feel free, but please only report one winner.
- Employees walk 5 laps around the chosen route. For each lap they walk, they earn one card for their hand. Employees must walk 5 times to earn a complete poker hand.
- Employees turn in complete hands to the dealer, who then determines who has the winning poker hand.

Neither skill nor speed is a factor; the winning objective is to have the best poker hand! People of all ability levels are encouraged to join in, get some exercise at their own pace, and try their hand at a friendly game of poker. So talk to your coworkers, choose a representative to opt in, select a date, time and location for the Poker Walk, communicate the event to your department, and get *On The Move!*
