Connecting to Wireless



Primary Network

Secure: For phones, tablets, computers

Other Kent Networks

Secure: For guests from other participating universities

Unsecure: For general public university guests

Secure: For gaming consoles, smart TVs, and multimedia devices (Apple TV, Roku)

Connecting Phones, Tablets, and Computers

Connect your computer and mobile devices to our secure, high-speed network, **Kent State Wireless**. Use your **FlashLine** username and password to log in.

Connecting Gaming and Multimedia Devices

Gaming consoles, smart TVs, and multimedia devices (e.g., Xbox, PS4, Roku, Apple TV) must be connected to Kent State's dedicated wireless **Multimedia Devices** network.

To register your device on the **Multimedia Devices** network, visit MultimediaDevices.kent.edu.

Note: Chromecasts and smart light bulbs are not compatible with any Kent State network.



Security Tip:

Be aware of your network. Never use non-password-protected public Wi-Fi to do online banking or any other type of personal business.

FlashLine

Understanding Your FlashLine Login and Kent State ID Number

Protect your **FlashLine** username and password, and your Kent State ID number like you protect your Social Security Number. These are your digital identity at Kent State and give access to many of your personal details such as:

- Email
- Social Security Number
- Kent State ID Number
- Bank account
- Direct deposit
- Financial Aid
- Home address
- Phone number
- and other personal info

NEVER share your password with anyone. Only use your Kent State ID number for official university business.

Forgot your password?
Access our online password recovery tool at support.kent.edu/forgot.

With this information, someone could take out a loan in your name, steal your financial aid, de-register you from classes, send spam email from your account, and more.

Flash ALERTS

Flash ALERTS is Kent State's official emergency text notification system.

Sign up to receive alerts about unscheduled university closings due to weather and other emergencies at www.kent.edu/flashalerts.

Beware of Email Scams (Phishing)

NEVER send personally identifiable information in an email, specifically:

- Kent State ID number
- Passwords
- Account or credit card numbers
- Social Security number

Kent State will NEVER ask you to send your password through email.

Only open attachments or links in emails that you are expecting.

Hover your cursor over the link to view the URL — make sure you recognize the website.

When in doubt, DON'T CLICK!

When using public Wi-Fi, connect to the VPN for a secure, encrypted connection. **AnyConnect VPN** is available free at software.kent.edu. Start it after you connect, and sign in with your FlashLine credentials.

Kaltura

Kaltura is Kent State's video hosting, sharing, and recording application. It is integrated with Blackboard Learn to allow videos to be embedded in any Blackboard text editor.

College of Architecture and Environmental Design, 329 CAED – Laser cutters, color plotters, and 3D printers. Costs vary.



Spark Innovation Studio

191-192 Schwartz Center – 3D printer, laser cutter, prototyping tools, project studio space, and more. Costs vary. library.kent.edu/spark

Student Multimedia Studio

Library First Floor – Workstations with Adobe Creative Cloud and other audio, video, and graphics editing software, scanners, 3D printers, 3D pens, and more. Free of charge for students.

Public printing is available in most computer labs by using your FLASHcard for payment. Print directly from your personal computer or mobile device by emailing the document to flashprint@kent.edu or by uploading the document to flashprint.kent.edu.

Double-sided printing is available in some computer labs. Choose “2-sided” in the print dialog box, and the **second side prints for FREE!**

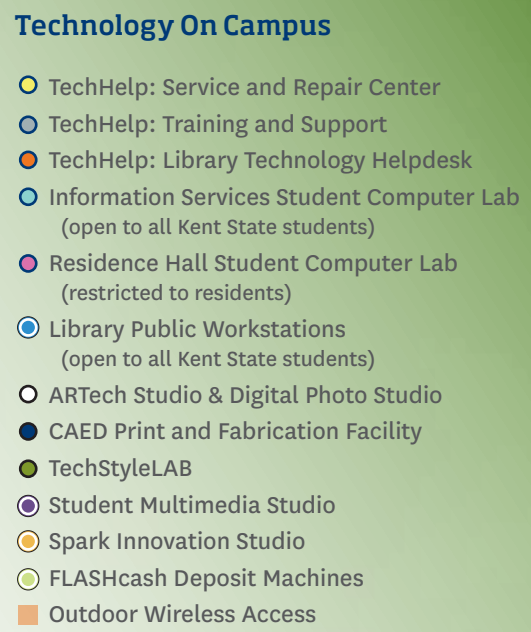
