Description of proposal:

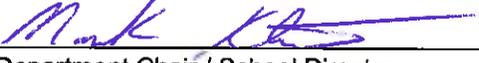
This proposal revises course requirements for the BS Hospitality Management major. Revisions include: removal and addition of courses to the core requirements, changes to credits, levels, and titles of existing courses, increase in the number of professional electives, and revision to the pre-requisite of an existing course. The revisions made more accurately reflect course content. The revisions will also assist in our continued accreditation by ensuring that our curriculum is competitive and meets student needs. Careful consideration was given to these revisions after benchmarking against other leading hospitality management programs, reviewing academic literature related to the preparation of graduates of hospitality management programs, and consulting with hospitality industry leaders.

Proposal Summary

B.S. Hospitality Management Program Revision

Description of Action, Including Intended Effect

The purpose of this proposal is to revise the course requirements for the Bachelor of Science Hospitality Management [BS HSPM] major as follows:

- Remove ENG 30063 *Business and Professional Writing* (3 cr) as a major program requirement. Due to the addition of new courses to the Hospitality Management curriculum during the last few years and assignments added to existing courses, students are able to gain adequate skills in industry-specific business and professional writing.
- Move HM 43029 *Hospitality Financial Policy* (3 cr) from a professional elective to a major program requirement and change the pre-requisite of the course from FIN 36053 *Business Finance* to HM 33026 *Hospitality Cost Control and Analysis*. Upon researching leading hospitality programs nation-wide, reading academic literature related to the preparation of hospitality graduates, and consulting with leaders in the hospitality industry, it is clear that the addition of HM 43029 to the HM core requirements is essential for the program to continue to adequately prepare graduate to succeed in the hospitality industry. Curriculum revisions concurrently being made to HM 33026 will make it an adequate pre-requisite for HM 43029. Business Finance will continue to be listed as a Hospitality Management Professional Elective for students who want to take it. Hospitality Management majors will be required to take 12-15 credits of professional electives. Students who declare a Business minor (which many HM majors do) will still take Business Finance. Many HM majors also complete the Management minor. HM majors are required to take seven business classes. The change in prerequisite keeps our curriculum in line with several other hospitality programs nation-wide.
- Increase credits for HM 13024 *Introduction to Hospitality Management* from 2 to 3. The additional credit is essential to introduce various segments of the hospitality industry to students in this introductory course. Instructors have expressed a need to do so for a few years.
- Change the name of HM 23030 *Lodging Operations* to *Hotel Operations* because "Hotel" is used more often in titles of similar courses in other hospitality programs.
- Decrease credits for HM 33026 *Hospitality Cost Control and Analysis* from 5 to 3. The content of HM 33026 can be reduced from 5 to 3 credit hours as students have become more competent using information technology and specifically, spreadsheets. These proficiencies allows for a reduction of weekly instruction hours. In addition, the revised course HM 4/53029 *Hospitality Financial Policy* will include some revenue-side content (such as revenue forecasting and management) that was historically taught in HM 33026 *Hospitality Cost Control and Analysis* due to the lack of a specific revenue management course.
- Decrease credits for HM 33029 *Catering and Banquet Preparation and Service* from 5 to 3 and rename the course *Catering and Banquet Management*. When the course was first established in the 1980s, the Hospitality Management (HM) curriculum had only one elective option with few opportunities for students to gain practical experience in the field. The number of HM courses has increased significantly with 18 different course options for professional electives. Many of the courses in the HM core and HM professional electives allow students to gain

- practical experience in the hospitality industry, and specifically in banquet operations. The revised course title more accurately reflects the new course format and content.
- Change the title of HM 33040 *Hotel Convention Sales and Services* to *Convention Sales and Management* to more accurately reflect the course content.
 - Change the title of HM 43040 *Strategic Lodging Management* to *Strategic Hotel Management*. "Hotel" is used more often in titles of similar courses in other hospitality programs. Students will more readily understand the context of the course with the new title and hence select this course as an elective if they are interested in a career in hotel management.
 - Elevate HM 33035 *Hospitality Service Quality Management* (3) to 43035 (and establish a slash course at the master's level-53035). The service encounter is in the core of hospitality management and service management and this course will provide a comprehensive, inter- and multi-disciplinary view of the characteristics and dynamics of successful and unsuccessful service encounters. In addition, this course was previously offered at the 5/40,000 level as a special topics course successfully.
 - Increase the number of Professional Elective credits required from 9-12 to 12-15. Increase in the number of professional electives needed to graduate will enable students majoring in Hospitality Management to take more specialty courses based on their career goals.
 - The format of the electives will be divided into specialties, making it easier for students to identify which courses would meet their career goals (see chart below).

Impact on Other Programs, Course Offerings, Students, Faculty, Staff (e.g., duplication issues)

- The English department was notified of the removal of ENG 30006 from the requirements.
- The Finance department was notified of the removal of FIN 36053 as the prerequisite for HM 43029.
- The changes to HM 13024 and 23030 will impact the Hospitality Management certificate, offered at the Ashtabula Campus. They were notified that their total number of credits

required for graduation will increase by 1 credit and that they will have to submit a proposal to revise their requirements if they want to maintain their current requirements.

- HM 23030 and HM 33040 are listed in the Event Planning minor curriculum. Sport Administration and Recreation, Park & Tourism Management were notified and the catalog pages will have to be updated to reflect the new course title.
- Other course revisions impact the Hospitality Minor, which is also going through a program revision that will address the changes.

The purpose of this email is to inform you of a change being made to a business prerequisite for a Hospitality Management (HM) course effective fall 2015. We are removing FIN 36053 Business Finance as the prerequisite for HM 43029 Hospitality Financial Policy and replacing it with HM 33026 Hospitality Cost Control and Analysis. A few notes:

- The removal of FIN 36053 Business Finance as a pre-requisite will not impact enrollment for this course as HM 43029 Hospitality Financial Policy has never been offered.
- Curriculum revisions concurrently being made to HM 33026 will make it an adequate pre-requisite for HM 43029
- We will still continue to list Business Finance in the list of Hospitality Management Professional Electives for students who want to take it. Hospitality Management majors will be required to take 12-15 credits of professional electives.
- Students who declare a Business minor (which many HM majors do) will still take Business Finance.
- Many HM majors also complete the Management minor
- HM majors are required to take several business classes:
 - Introduction to Computer Applications
 - Introduction to Financial Accounting
 - Principles of Management
 - Micro Econ
 - Macro Econ
 - Human Resources Management
 - Principles of Marketing
- The change in prerequisite keeps our curriculum in line with several other hospitality programs nation-wide. It is very typical for other hospitality programs to offer context specific hospitality financial management courses.
