Proposal Summary Hospitality Management Minor Revision

Description of Action, Including Intended Effect

The purpose of this proposal is to revise the course requirements for the Minor in Hospitality Management [HSPM] as follows:

- Increase credits for HM 13024 Introduction to Hospitality Management from 2 to 3, and change the title of 23030 Lodging Operations to Hotel Operations
- Move HM 33026 Hospitality Cost Control and Analysis (3) from an elective to a requirement because it is essential for students to gain basic knowledge of hospitality finance.
- Add the following note to required course HM 43092 Practicum in Hospitality Management**: ** Students are encouraged to complete the majority of the required courses in the minor before taking practicum. Students may register for HM 43092 (with permission) without completion of the prerequisite courses. Students who have completed a practicum/internship in another program area that had a significant hospitality component may be able to use the practicum/internship toward the practicum requirement in the minor with hospitality management faculty approval.
- Reduce the minimum number of credits required for electives from 6-10 to 3
- Remove the following courses from the list of electives:
 - HM 33020 Legal Issues in the Hospitality Industry (3)
 - o HM 33029 Catering and Banquet Preparation and Services (5)
 - o HM 33035 Hospitality Service Quality Management (3)
 - o HM 33036 Club Management (3)
 - o HM 41095 Special Topics in Hospitality Management (1-4)
 - o RPTM 36060 Entrepreneurial Approaches to Leisure and Hospitality Services (3)
- Add the following courses to the list of electives:
 - o HM 33070 International Cuisine (4)
 - o HM 3777 Casino Management and Gaming Operations (3)
 - o HM 43040 Strategic Hotel Management (3) [new title]
 - O Other HM course, as approved by faculty advisor
- Keep the following courses in the list of electives: HM 33040 Convention Sales and Management
 (3) [new title], HM 43029 Hospitality Financial Policy (3), and HM 43043 Hospitality Meetings Management (3)

The list of electives more accurately reflects the courses that HSPM minors are more likely to take. It also allows for flexibility as HSPM minors may wish to take an HSPM elective not listed (with the approval of a Hospitality Management faculty advisor), as it may better fit the student's career goals.

• The minimum number of credits for completion of the minor will change from 23-27 to 24

Overall, the revisions are needed to prepare HSPM minors for employment in the hospitality industry.

Impact on Other Programs, Course Offerings, Students, Faculty, Staff (e.g., duplication issues) Recreations, Park and Tourism Management was notified of the removal of RPTM 36060 from the list of electives.

The HSPM program is aware that students who wish to choose courses that are not listed in the electives will have to submit an exception form to make a substitution.


