It also revises: the number of credit hours from 4 to 3, the prerequisites, the content outline, and total contact hours. The reduction in credit hours is made to reflect the omission of individual hours of supervision by the KSU supervisor. Students will continue to receive supervision by their on-site supervisors and group supervision from their KSU supervisor. CES 6/78066 and 6/78067 are added as prerequisites because the information provided in these courses is needed to conduct the work in the practicum experience. Furthermore, this course had been slashed with CHDS 78392 which has been inactivated; therefore, the slash designation is being removed.
