## **Proposal Summary**

Title: EDPF 29535 Education in a Democratic Society

Subject Specification: Change in prerequisites for above course

**Background Information:** This proposal is to change the prerequisite for this course from "admission to education as a major or minor" to "No prerequisite." This change will serve to open the course to students from around the university who are interested in, but not yet committed to, the profession of teaching.

Alternatives and Consequences: None

Specific Recommendation and Justification: Inasmuch as there is no such "exploratory" course in the College or University, and since EHHS does receive many internal transfers into the education program each year--often when students are already upper classmen--this change in prerequisites will enable interested students to explore the profession prior to committing to it. The curriculum will be the same for both pre-education majors and majors in other fields of study and it will still serve as the first course for education majors, since it is a prerequisite for other coursework in professional education.
