Re: Revisions to HED program requirements

This proposal is to revise the BS degree in Community Health Ed, and the MED and PHD degrees in Health Education and Promotion. Proposal Summary

Title: Program requirement revisions to the Bachelor of Science Degree in Community Health Education (CHED).

Subject Specification: This proposal is to revise the program requirements for the Bachelor of Science Degree in Community Health Education [BS CHED] to reflect course catalog updates.

Background Information: The School of Health Sciences offers a Bachelor's Degree in Community Health Education. At this time, revisions are needed both in coursework and content to the B.S. CHED due mainly to the establishment of the College of Public Health (CPH). The program changes will remove an inactivated course (and its regional equivalent) and replace it with another. Revisions to the program electives are also needed to bring current the course options available to students.

D. **Alternatives and Consequences**: Not updating the program would cause duplication of core concepts and coursework with the College of Public Health (*Environmental Health* which is one of their core areas of instruction). Although the HEDP Program originally established the Environmental Health course, we believe it is best to give it up at this time since it is a core course in public health. Consequences of updating the coursework would be 1) further differentiating Health Education from Public Health and 2) improved coverage of health education competencies resulting in better preparation of our students for the Certified Health Education Specialist credential.

Specific Recommendations:

- Remove courses from Additional Program Requirements: HED 41561 Environmental Health (inactivated) and ENVT 10001 Introduction to Environmental Technology (Trumbull Campus).
- 2. Add PH 20006 Environmental Health Science (3) to Additional Program Requirements.
- 3. Remove JMC 20001 Media Power and Culture from Additional Program Requirement, elective section and specify it as a Kent Core Social Sciences course requirement. Because Media Power and Culture is a prerequisite for the other JMC courses, it does not make sense to have it listed as a "select one" elective among subsequent JMC courses. This will increase the student's potential to take an additional JMC course which is important to their understanding of writing and mass communication skills needed in this field.

4. Add PH 20004 *Public Health Research* (3) as a third option under Major Program Requirements, elective section.



DESCRIPTION: The Bachelor of Science in Community Health Education gives students the necessary tools to plan, implement and evaluate health

education programs for individuals, communities and groups. Recognizing the importance of promoting good health and preventing disease, the major features a 12-credit capstone internship experience during which the student works with a health educator in a community setting. Courses qualify students to take the Certified Health Education Specialist Exam administered by the National

Commission for Health Education Credentialing.

ADMISSION Students admitted to the College of Education, Health, and Human Services as freshmen must have been fully admitted to the REQUIREMENTS:

university. Admission to the college does not guarantee admission to a major and/or admission to professional coursework for a selective admission program. To be admitted directly into a teacher education program and Community Health, it is required that new freshmen have a 2.75 high school GPA and 16 units of college preparatory curriculum or a 21 ACT or 980 SAT score. Students who do not meet the GPA requirements of their intended major may enroll as pre-majors for selected programs or EHHS General until

which time they have the required 2.75 GPA.

Students are admitted to health and human services programs and educational studies using the university admission criteria (see the Entering the University section of this Catalog), with the exception of the sport administration program, which requires a 2.75 high school GPA for entering freshmen and a 21 ACT or 980 SAT score. Selective admission criteria are used in some programs in the college. Students who do not meet the GPA requirements of their intended major may enroll as pre-majors for selected programs or EHHS General until which time they have the required GPA. Students desiring to major in human development and family studies or speech pathology and audiology are admitted as pre-majors and later are accepted into the appropriate program only after specific

requirements have been met. It is imperative that the student contact the individual school for detailed information. Minimum 121 credit hours. Minimum 2.75 cumulative and major GPA

HEDP Program Meeting Minutes 9/22/2010

Present: Drs. Backus, Bernert, Ding, Kerr, Symons, Wagner

Absent: Dr. Axiotis

- I. Minutes of August 23, 2010 were reviewed with one correction in paragraph 2 which should now read-"Drs. Symons and Bernert had a long discussion about whether to require the new Resources and Training in HEDP class for the school health licensure concentration in lieu of one of the other content classes" rather than the Disease class. Donna moved approval of the minutes, Laurie seconded, unanimous approval.
- II. Dr. Kerr reported meeting with Susan Augustine for 2.5 hours on Monday. Curriculum revisions were summarized and clarified by Dr. Kerr using the Proposal Summary Sheets. Additional changes were made to the sheets at the meeting and those changes are reflected in the attached proposal summaries. For classes that we are no longer offering, the decision was to both remove the classes from the program sheets and eventually deactivate the classes.
 - UG Community Health Program (see revised proposal summary sheet).
 Donna moved to accept, Laurie seconded, unanimous approval of changes.
 - b. M.Ed. in HEDP (see revised proposal summary sheet). Laurie moved to accept, Cindy seconded, unanimous approval.
 - c. Ph.D. in HEDP (see revised proposal summary sheet). Kele moved to accept, Donna seconded, unanimous approval of changes.
 Discussion of university requirement of 21 hours per week of student work for any course titled "internship" or "practicum". According to Susan Augustine an internship implies an external experience. Therefore the doctoral internship course title was changed from Internship to Practicum. (see proposal sheet). Faculty were encouraged to give doctoral students IP grades on the internship until the time requirements were met.
- III. Discussion of Program Identity by Dr. Wagner as she has heard students have misperceptions and complaints about our program as "school health only." Concerns about class content regarding school and community coverage were also discussed. It was determined that each class that includes both school and community majors should attend to needs of both. Assignments such as "lesson plans" may want to be renamed to minimize the "school impression". Dr. Kerr recommended naming them "presentations" that could be classroom presentations or community presentations.
- IV. Dr. Symons gave a brief report about our meeting with PE faculty regarding the HPE major and changes to the content. The major will be reduced by 6 credits (1 HED class and 1 PE class). She will follow up with

- roadmap changes with Dr. Kerr who will give them to Susan Augustine to reflect changes and assure that both PE and Health roadmaps are the same for the HPE major.
- V. Concerns regarding the privacy issue in the conference room were expressed (GAs can hear through the pull down metal opening). It was recommended that a bulletin board be installed over the metal opening and perhaps some insulation material be placed in between to remedy this issue and save costs.
 - Concerns with GA using faculty appropriate titles were expressedparticularly calling faculty and school director "Dr." and faculty referring to each other in this manner in front of students as well.
- VI. Grading Issues were briefly discussed, particularly the improper use of the incomplete grade. Dr. Kerr discussed clarifying grades (IP, I, NS, NF) and when they are to be used in writing and sending to all faculty (full and part time) and GAs. Also discussed was the procedure for extending an Incomplete if the student is ill for an extended period and the fact that if the contract is not fulfilled an extension has to be approved by the dean and registrar before the student is able to proceed in their coursework.
