Re: Establish Special Course Fees

PEB 10095 Special Topics: Intermediate Spinning (1 cr). This course requires the use of specialized equipment that requires regular maintenance and upkeep to function properly. Recreational Services is an Auxiliary Department and receives no funding from the University. This \$35 fee allows the facility to maintain its current operating procedures and to offer effective instruction for students. The fee increase will not be substantial enough to have an impact on the students wishing to enroll in these courses. However, without this fee, course offerings will have to be cancelled.

All university students who want to participate in a spinning class at the Student Recreation Center purchase a 12 punch pass for \$30 which allows them to attend 12 classes. They can also purchase a \$40 pass which allows them to attend as many classes as they want during the semester. The Recreation Center is requesting \$35 for the semester for PEB 10095 students to participate in approximately 30 classes.
