

Tenure Track Faculty Position in Social/Health Psychology

The Department of Psychological Sciences at Kent State University seeks applicants for a tenure-track position in Social/Health Psychology beginning in Fall 2015. A Ph.D. in psychology is required. Applicants at the Associate or Full level will also be considered, but should have demonstrated productivity and strong track record of extramural funding.

The candidate should have a program of research in social and/or health psychology, broadly defined (e.g., close relationships and health, health behavior, research linking psychological processes with biological processes and health outcomes, psycho-social research regarding major diseases and chronic health problems, such as coronary heart disease, cancer, obesity, AIDS, chronic pain, etc.). The candidate will contribute to graduate training in our Social Psychology Ph.D. program and graduate specialization in Health Psychology, and should complement the existing research programs of our social and health psychology faculty.

Successful candidates will be expected to develop a productive research program, seek extramural funding, and exhibit a commitment to teaching graduate and undergraduate courses. Our faculty are highly productive researchers who have demonstrated success in attracting substantial federal funding in support of their research programs. Our department is ranked by the National Science Foundation as one of the top 100 psychology departments in extramural research funding. Our department's health research is facilitated by strong, collaborative ties with many local hospitals.
