



KSUtube Video Conversion Troubleshooting

Summary

KSUtube is a great way to share video within the Kent State University community. It allows students, instructors and staff members to deliver streaming video in minutes, without having to deal with messy file conversions or writing custom flash players. Videos can meet copyright guidelines through the use of streaming and password protection.

Trouble Shooting

Video files come in a wide variety of formats depending upon such features as manufacturer, purpose and quality. This can be challenging for individuals that are looking to share their files online. KSUtube typically accepts the following: mov, wmv, avi, mpg, rv, rm, ram, flv, m4v, mp4, mp3, and wav. Occasionally, however, you will have to convert files to a more widely accepted format such as mov or avi before uploading. This is commonly the case when using programs such as Wimba. If your video plays properly using a program such as VLC (<http://www.videolan.org/>) but still will not upload, convert and re-attempt the upload.

Conversion Software

The program, Any Video Converter, is a free converter that handles many common video formats. It has an easy to use drag and drop interface that allows for the conversion of common formats including AVI, FLV, MOV, MP4, MPG, M2TS, MTS, RM, RMVB, QT, and WMV and outputs to formats such as AVI, WMV, MPG, MP4, MKV, SWF, and FLV.
