What can I do with an ADED Science major?

Teach grades 7-12 science in public schools.

Can I specialize?

You can choose any of the following areas in which to specialize:

- Life Science
- Physical Science
- Earth Science
- Integrated Science
- Life Science/Chemistry

The integrated science licensure is currently most marketable as it prepares preservice teachers to teach all science subjects, grades 7-12. The life science, life/chem, physical science, and earth science degrees are 4-year degrees, while the integrated science degree is a 5-year degree.

Small program with real-world experience

Within this program, you will spend hundreds of hours in various field experiences including a 12-week student teaching internship in a public school. You will have many opportunities to try out the techniques you are learning in science teaching methods courses.
