Admission to the Professional Phase

Admission to some upper-division hospitality management (HM) courses is controlled. Students must be admitted to the Professional Phase by showing evidence of having met the following requirements:

- Minimum 2.00 GPA overall and 2.25 major GPA
- Valid standard first aid, and CPR certificates
- 400 approved work hours within the hospitality industry, Cuyahoga Community College students may use Hospitality Field Experience hours toward this requirement with documentation and approval by Kent State Hospitality Faculty
- ServSafe® Certificate. Certificate may be obtained prior to transfer while attending Tri-C, but will need to still be valid at time of students being admitted to the Professional Phase.
- Completion of, or enrollment in, the following courses: HM 13022, 13023, 13024, and 23030. Note: These courses may be transferred from Tri-C
