**REQUEST AND RECOMMENDATION**

**Kent State University**  
Career-Technical Workforce Development License

**Request:**

Kent State University requests approval to offer a baccalaureate level program leading to the Ohio Career-Technical Workforce Development License.

**Profile:**

Kent State University is a public university that was founded in 1910. The university has a specific mission to discover, create, apply and share knowledge, as well as to foster ethical and humanitarian values in the service of Ohio and the global community. Located in Kent, Ohio, the university has an enrollment of more than 22,000 undergraduate students and 5,500 graduate students.

**Accreditation/Authorization:**

Kent State University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) until its next scheduled review in 2022. Kent State University's educator preparation programs are accredited by National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) until the next review, by the successor organization, Council for Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP), in 2023.

**Background:**

Kent State University is submitting its request to ensure program alignment with Ohio standards and requirements. Per ORC 3319.223 requirements consist of twenty-four semester hours, or equivalent and include a performance-based assessment. Kent State University offers the program leading to the Career-Technical Workforce Development License at the baccalaureate level.

**Recommendation:**

Kent State University's Career-Technical Workforce Development License preparation program meets the Chancellor's requirements for program approval and the State Board of Education's minimum standards for baccalaureate level programs leading to the Career-Technical Workforce Development License. Approval is recommended for Kent State University's baccalaureate level program leading to the Career-Technical Workforce Development License until the fall 2024 review cycle. The Chancellor may, in his judgement, withdraw approval or require additional review if Kent State University fails to meet the Chancellor's standards for licensure programs or receives a sanction by CAEP.


