## **Graduation Requirements**

Requirements to graduate with the BBA degree program: To graduate, students must have minimum 120 credit hours, 39 upper-division credit hours of coursework, a minimum 2.00 major GPA and minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA. They must also fulfill an approved experiential learning experience, a two-course diversity requirement (domestic and global), complete a writing intensive course with a minimum C (2.000) grade. More specific graduation requirement information can be found in the Academic Policies section of the Kent State University Catalog ([www.kent.edu/catalog](http://www.kent.edu/catalog)).

## **Guaranteed MBA Admission Program**

Students following this pathway are also eligible for direct admission into the MBA. Through this program, students can complete their bachelor's degree and MBA, and count up to 9 credit hours of graduate coursework toward both degrees.

Incoming Transfer Student Requirements:

- Transfer GPA of 3.200 or better for students with 30+ college credits
- Transfer students with 29 credits or less will be evaluated on a combination of their college level coursework GPA and high school GPA
- Quantitative Course Requirements – Students must take two (2) quantitative courses, such as algebra for calculus, statistics, or business analytics and receive a “B” or higher in both courses. For the BBA in General Business, MATH 11010, MATH 11012, and/or MGMT 24056 with a B/3.0 or better will satisfy the quantitative course requirement.
