Graduation Requirements

Requirements to graduate with the BBA degree program: To graduate, students must have minimum 120 credit hours, 39 upper-division credit hours of coursework, a minimum 2.00 major GPA and minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA. They must also fulfill an approved experiential learning experience, a two-course diversity requirement (domestic and global), complete a writing intensive course with a minimum C (2.000) grade. More specific graduation requirement information can be found in the Academic Policies section of the Kent State University Catalog (www.kent.edu/catalog).

Guaranteed MBA Admission Program

Students following this pathway are also eligible for direct admission into the MBA. Through this program, students can complete their bachelor's degree and MBA, and count up to 9 credit hours of graduate coursework toward both degrees.

Incoming Transfer Student Requirements:

- Transfer GPA of 3.200 or better for students with 30+ college credits
- Transfer students with 29 credits or less will be evaluated on a combination of their college level coursework GPA and high school GPA
- Quantitative Course Requirements Students must take two (2) quantitative courses, such as algebra for calculus, statistics, or business analytics and receive a "B" or higher in both courses. For the BBA in General Business, MATH 11010, MATH 11012, and/or MGMT 24056 with a B/3.0 or better will satisfy the quantitative course requirement.
