Articulation Criteria and Articulation Benefits

1. *The standard articulation criteria (“Articulation Criteria”) are:*

- a. Completion of a diploma program at New Castle School of Trades that consists of 1,000 or more clock hours.
- b. Submission of an official transcript from New Castle School of Trades indicating diploma completion.

2. *The articulation benefits (“Articulation Benefits”) are:*

- a. Facilitates articulation of a diploma between the School and Kent State, Associate of Technical Study, Individualized Program (See Appendix 1 and Appendix 2).
- b. Benefits Northeast Ohio by infusing the job market with qualified graduates.
- c. Motivates students to continue pursuing postsecondary education.
