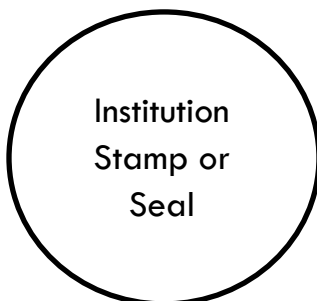

Definitions of Student Types

International Undergraduate Guest

An international applicant who would like to take a limited number of undergraduate courses for credit. In order to apply as a guest, students must have graduated from high school or be currently enrolled at another institution. International guest students can only enroll for up to 18 semester hours and cannot earn a degree.

International Visiting Student

In order to apply as an international visiting student, students must have graduated from high school or be currently enrolled at another institution. A visiting student is short-term and not working toward a degree at Kent State. Students may remain in this special status for one academic year or until a maximum of 45 semester hours of credit is earned.

Student from Exchange Partner

An international applicant who is currently working toward the equivalent of an American bachelor's degree at the tertiary level of education at their home partnering institution with Kent State University. An exchange student is short-term and not working toward a degree at Kent State.
