University Teaching and Research Councils

Both the University Teaching Council and University Research Council offer several funding opportunities for faculty.

Kent State Stark is well represented on these Councils with several faculty from the Stark Campus serving on each.

University Teaching Council (UTC)

In conjunction with the Center for Teaching and Learning (CTL), the UTC supports teaching and curriculum development to engage faculty and students in the learning process and provide excellence in scholarship. The UTC offers the following grants during the year:

- Summer Teaching Development Grants, deadline February, (\$4,500 for 5 week, \$9,000 for 10 week, or \$9,000 total for collaborative proposal)
- Teaching Conference Travel Grant (up to \$800 domestic, \$1,000 international)
- Teaching Development Grant (up to \$1,000 / year)
- Workshop Grant (up to \$2,000)

University Research Council (URC)

University Research Council aims to foster and stimulate research efforts and creative projects by providing financial support for artistic and scholarly work. The URC offers the following grants throughout the year:

- Academic Year and Summer Research/Creative Activity Appointments, deadline first Monday in October at 5 p.m. (\$10,000)
- Professional Conference Support (up to \$750/year)
- Research Scholarly Activity Support (less than \$500)
- Research Scholarly Activity Support (\$500-\$2,500 depending on activity/year, or up to \$3,500 involving undergraduate research)
- Page Charge Request
- Reprint Request

Kent State Stark Grant Activity Update

Grant Activity by Quarter, Fiscal Years 2017 – 2019

Table 1 displays grant submissions by quarter and outcomes and award rates for the corresponding quarterly grant submissions. The Stark Campus closed out fiscal year (FY) 2018 with 63 grant submissions valued at \$1.6 million, compared to 61 submissions in FY 2017 valued at \$5 million.

FY 2018 notifications will not be closed out until we are notified of all grants submitted in FY 2018 (in November 2018). In FY 2018, 39 grants have been awarded to date, valued at \$461 thousand with 1 grant pending valued at \$17,405, which compares to 31 awards valued at \$1.1 million in FY 2017. Kent State Stark currently has a 63% award rate based on the number of proposals for FY 2018 and a 30% award rate based on the dollar value, compared to 51% and 23%, respectively, in FY 2017.

Through the first four months of FY 2019, 19 grants valued at \$448,169 have been submitted, and 10 have been awarded, valued at \$224,835 and the remaining 10 are pending.
