

Local Enrollment in Higher Education and Elementary and Secondary Schools







Undergraduate enrollment at Kent State Stark increased 0.7% from 2010 to 2018. At the three four-year private universities in Stark County, enrollment declined by 16.2% from 2010 to 2016. (with Mount Union declining by 3%, Walsh by 8%, and Malone by 37%). (Figure 1)

Enrollment at area public elementary and secondary schools is also declining. (Figures 2a-4c)

Kent State Stark Grant Activity Update

Grant Activity by Quarter, Fiscal Years 2017 – 2019

Table 1 displays grant submissions by quarter and outcomes and award rates for the corresponding quarterly grant submissions. The Stark Campus closed out fiscal year (FY) 2018 with 63 grant submissions valued at \$1.6 million, compared to 61 submissions in FY 2017 valued at \$5 million.

FY 2018 notifications will not be closed out until we are notified of all grants submitted in FY 2018 (in November 2018). In FY 2018, 39 grants have been awarded to date, valued at \$461 thousand with 1 grant pending valued at \$17,405, which compares to 31 awards valued at \$1.1 million in FY 2017. Kent State Stark currently has a 63% award rate based on the number of proposals for FY 2018 and a 30% award rate based on the dollar value, compared to 51% and 23%, respectively, in FY 2017.

In the first quarter of FY 2019, ten grants valued at \$276,847 have been submitted to date, and two have been awarded, valued at \$101,487 and the other eight are pending.

- Arts in Stark, <u>Special Projects Grant</u>, for arts-related projects that demonstrate a commitment of artistic excellence, community impact and outreach, deadline November 9, 2018 (for concept form) and November 16, 2018 (application).

 state level and working on ending the criminalization and over-incarceration of youth in the US and policy and system

STEM, Environment

- American Chemical Society, <u>ACS Award for Encouraging Women into Careers in Chemical Sciences</u>, (\$5,000 + \$10,000 to an academic institution + up to \$1,500 to travel to accept award), to recognize significant accomplishments by individuals who have stimulated or fostered the interest of women in chemistry and promoted their professional development as chemists or chemical engineers, deadline November 1, 2018.
- American Chemical Society, American Chemical Society Petroleum Research Fund, <u>Undergraduate Research Grants</u>,
 (\$70,000 over 3 years), for scientists with established programs of research at non-doctoral departments. UR grants are
 used to illustrate the proof of principle, i.e., feasibility, and accordingly, are to be viewed as seed money for generating
 preliminary results that can be used to apply for continuation funding from other agencies, deadline October 19, 2018.
- Muskingum Watershed Conservancy Foundation, <u>Grants</u>, to pursue projects and programs primarily on or adjacent to
 Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District lands and waters that promote and support conservation, outdoor recreation,
 and other issues related to MWCD's mission, deadline quarterly with the next deadline of December 31, 2018.
- National Council of Teachers of Mathematics (NCTM), <u>7-12 Classroom Research Grants</u>, (up to \$6,000), to support and encourage classroom-based research in precollege mathematics education in collaboration with college or university mathematics educators, deadline November 2, 2018.
