Previously titled the Millennial Leadership Exchange, this event is held each spring at Kent State University at Tuscarawas. Over the past five years, area leaders have helped share their passion with our community's young people through presentations, workshops and networking.

We invite professionals in all fields and levels to consider being a part of our leadership programming for local young people. You are invited to complete an RFP to present a TED-Style talk for the entire group, and/or to complete an RFP about workshop or demonstration programming you would like to share with a small group.

We will be accepting your applications until Sunday, September 15, 2019. The event will be held on Friday, February 21, 2020, in the Performing Arts Center of Kent State University at Tuscarawas.

The ideal presentation will:

- be geared toward an audience of 16-22 year-old young people
- be visually engaging with a PowerPoint presentation; be memorable, enlightening, and inspiring in presentation style (similar to presentations found at <a href="https://www.ted.com">www.ted.com</a>)
- have a clear theme or message that serves to do one of the following
  - help young people gain insight into attributes and practices that will assist them in becoming strong community leaders
  - share examples and personal life experiences that support the advice offered and the overall theme of the presentation
  - show young people that there are many forms of success and that all types of leaders are needed

We are not looking for a Leadership 101-style lecture or a life story. What we are looking for is a creative strategy for conveying, with intelligence and gusto, what you wished you'd known when, as a young person, you were beginning your journey toward success and leadership.

The ideal workshop/demonstration will:

- Share your passion for civic engagement and leadership within your profession or community
- Help students understand the soft skills that they need to become leaders in their professions and communities (i.e. interview skills, basic financial planning, communication strategies, etc.)
- Give students hands-on activities that will help them formulate their own answers to questions about their future and their passions.
