MENTORING COMMITTEES

At Kent State University Tuscarawas, we recognize that all faculty can make use of personal and professional mentoring at various points in their career. Because mentoring probationary faculty is the most critical in terms of RTP, we assign official one-on-one mentors for each new faculty member.

In addition to that relationship, successful probationary faculty realize that one mentor is usually not enough. We encourage all faculty to fill out their own personal mentoring map, as some areas need to be peopled with non-university names, particularly in the areas of Safe Space and Emotional Support.

Please take the time to fill out your own personal mentoring map to see if you are in need of additional mentoring. This packet will follow the personal mentoring map for local resources.

Additionally, most of us need to find mentors in our Intellectual Communities by discipline, whether that means within our home departments/colleges or in our professional organizations. In order to help faculty make helpful connections, we are providing a variety of resources, many of them campus faculty, who can help in a variety of areas.

EMOTIONAL SUPPORT

Ideally, Kent State Tuscarawas will become your professional home, a place where you feel supported in your work and celebrated in your successes.

INTELLECTUAL COMMUNITY

SPONSORSHIP

This group will rotate based on individual mentors. This is the group of people who should be advocates for the file and the candidate. Ideally they will know the candidate and the file well, and they will provide feedback at the RTP table. (Sometimes that feedback may take the form of written comments provided to the Faculty Chair.)

TT and NTT Mentor Coordinators will always be asked to attend RTP meetings, so they will always be a voice for the candidate. Faculty should also consider who might advocate for them at the department or college level, and who else locally might be able to help if they are privy to file materials and situations prior to the vote.

Faculty should see who is on the Representative FC to help make decisions about individuals to go to for feedback and sponsorship.


