

Proposals will be considered in the following formats, but due to the limited number of roundtable spaces, authors may be asked to present in an alternate format. All proposals must align with the Mission and Vision of the Strategic Roadmap for a Distinctive Kent State:

This is an open call, however, if you received funding from the University Teaching Council, you are obligated to submit an abstract and present your work.

VISION — To be a community of change agents whose collective commitment to learning sparks epic thinking, meaningful voice and invaluable outcomes to better our society.

MISSION — We transform lives and communities through the power of discovery, learning and creative expression in an inclusive environment.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS: PLEASE NOTE:

- Indicate submission division (Roundtable or Poster).
 (If your choice cannot be honored, you will be asked to present in a different format.)
- Submit a clearly worded 100 to 150 word abstract describing the nature of the work as it pertains to this proposal. Include its applicability to teaching and how the authors will engage participants.
- Include title (no more than 10 words), all authors and institutions.
- Include address, phone number and email addresses of all authors.
